

Solid Blocking

- "Solid Blocking" refers to addition support material sometimes placed below subfloor components of resilient hardwood sports floors.
- Solid Blocking is often included in areas such as: below bleachers in the closed stacked position, below portable goals in the stationary position, and at doorway entrances.
- Solid Blocking is not typically provided in large sheets of material but rather in elongated wood sections usually 2"-3" wide in a profile height equal to the thickness of resilient components included below panel subfloors, or the combined height of wood nailing sections and resilient components when included below sleeper subfloors.
- The blocking strips normally align perpendicular to the finished flooring direction and are most typically spaced approximately 12" on center or less below panel subfloors, and inserted between wood nailing sections in sleeper subfloors.
- Blocking strips can be mechanically attached or glued or held in place by pressure from the floor system.
