# **NORTHERN WHITE OAK**





Consistent, neutral color and grain, Northern White Oak is ideal for custom staining. Due to it's light sapwood and light to nutty brown heartwood color, White Oak creates a floor with a strong, clean look. The wood flooring is mostly straight grained with a medium to coarse texture and an open grain appearance.

Generally, White Oak will have more "character" than Red Oak due to the longer rays. The occasional crotches, swirls and burls in this wood works well in traditional as well as contemporary interiors. Synonymous with high quality and durability, white oak has been used for more than a century in hard wood flooring.



















CLEAR

Minimum amount of discoloration and other marks. Little to no color variation allowed. **Average board length is 39".** 



**SELECT & BETTER** 

Showing a slight degree of color variation compared to Clear grade. Only pin knots and minimal mineral streaks allowed. **Average board length is 39".** 



#1 COMMON

Color variations, minor sound knots, mineral streaks and other character flaws permitted. **Average board length is 33".** 



#2 COMMON

Allows prominent natural color variation, various imperfections and obvious character marks. Open knots up to a dime size and through holes up to 1/4" are allowed. Average board length is 27".



**GLACIER** 

Character grade flooring with long average length. All character flaws and imperfections are permitted. This flooring will have extensive color variation. Pencil width knots are allowed to go all the way through the board. Average board length is 31".

### **MATERIAL WARRANTY**

Aacer Flooring warrants that the products have been manufactured in compliance with the grading rules of Aacer Flooring, and will be free from manufacturing defects, which are limited to improper milling or improper drying only. Manufacturing defects do not include natural wood characteristics such as mineral streaks, knots, grain variations, and normal minor differences between color samples and the color of installed floors. These are normal characteristics and are not defects.
